Not sure where to start?

- Check your Academic Progress in <u>Workday</u> or speak with an Advisor in your faculty to determine the best time to go on Exchange:
 - \circ Which credits do you still need to fulfill (e.g. requirements, electives...)
 - when are your degree required courses offered at UBC? (e.g. only offered in term 1)
- Review the Partner University Pages for institutions you're interested in to:
 - o connect to the partner's website and find out what courses are typically offered
 - o verify the credit equivalency ratio to determine how the partner credits will transfer back to UBC
 - see examples of courses other UBC students have transferred back from exchange
- On the partner university's own course website:
 - note that course catalogues for your term abroad might not be published yet; choose potential courses from the most recent listings
 - o look for courses that are open to exchange students
 - o remember to check the language of instruction
 - check the level of the course and if there are any pre-requisites
- Review the exchange Transfer Credit Process for your UBC campus (<u>Vancouver</u> or <u>Okanagan</u>) to understand how your exchange credits transfer back to UBC:
 - Depending on the course content, courses you take on exchange can transfer back as equivalent to a specific UBC course (e.g. ANTH 331), unassigned credit at the department level (e.g. ANTH 3rd), unassigned credit at the faculty level (e.g. ARTS 1st) or Elective credit (ELEV 1st).
 - o note relevant deadlines for initiating review of your courses for transfer credit
