

Cheat sheet: Maintaining academic integrity with generative artificial intelligence

- Use of generative artificial intelligence (AI) is a COURSE-LEVEL decision at UBC
- Without explicit permission from your instructor, use of AI could be considered “use or facilitation of unauthorized means to complete an examination or coursework” ([UBC Okanagan Academic Calendar 3.1](#))
- To avoid committing academic misconduct:
 - If your instructor says you CAN use AI, read policies carefully and work only within the boundaries set.
 - If your instructor says you CAN'T use AI, do not use it.
 - If your instructor DOES NOT SPECIFY if you can use AI, ask your instructor for clarification or do not use it.
- Not just ChatGPT! Did you know that Grammarly has new generative AI integration (GrammarlyGo)? While using this tool for word processing, spellcheck, and non-generative AI functions may be permitted, use of its generative AI tools for assignments or tests could be considered academic misconduct if you don't have permission from your instructor. To avoid academic misconduct, ask your instructor for clarification on what is permitted *before* completing your assignment!
