STEP 1 ACCEPT OFFER

Sign in to your Applicant Service Centre (ASC). Accept your offer of admission and pay the acceptance fee.

STEP 2 CHECK REGISTRATION DATE

Log into Workday and click the "Academics" app, then "Registration & Courses" to find your Registration Appointment. Be sure to register as soon as your registration opens as courses fill up quickly. Registration is online only.

View registration dates, based on year level.

STEP 3 CREATE A SAVED SCHEDULE

In Workday, access the **Saved Schedule tool** to draft your timetable and ensure there are no conflicts. Create Saved Schedules by viewing individual courses under "Find Course Sections" and clicking "Add to Saved Schedule" at the bottom of the page. Make sure to create at least one Saved Schedule each for Terms 1 and 2.

STEP 4 REGISTER

On your registration date, sign in to Workday and register for the courses from your preferred Saved Schedules for both Term 1 and Term 2. Verify that you have registered in all required components of the course (lecture, lab, tutorial, and seminar) by clicking the "View Registered Courses" button. When registering for courses, you may see an error alert for a variety of reasons. Click on the alert for further information.

REGISTRATION GUIDE

Welcome to the UBC Okanagan Bachelor of Education. Please use this guide to help you plan for your Term 1 (September-December) and Term 2 (January-April) courses.

Note: It is important to register in your Term 1 and Term 2 courses all at once.

All teacher candidates take the same core courses. Teacher candidates register for the core courses using Workday. To access the education course schedule, open the Academics app within Workday, click "Registration & Courses", and select "Find Course Sections". Once you enter the appropriate Winter Term Start Date(s) and Academic Level, you will be able to search for the specific courses you would like to register in.

The timetable below identifies the core courses and in which term you must register for them.

Note: EDUC_O courses do not follow the same four-month schedule that most of the university's courses use. As such, you may receive a warning of a schedule conflict when you register for courses. You can disregard this warning.
